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Jordan Downs Public Housing Redevelopment: Residents and Community members Participate in Fifth Community meeting

WHAT: Residents and community members have provided input and voiced their ideas throughout the year regarding the project. The Jordan Downs redevelopment project was initiated to improve the quality of housing and quantity of affordable housing in Los Angeles. In partnership with Congresswoman Maxine Waters [D-CA], Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa and Councilwoman Janice Hahn, The Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles is currently in the planning phase of the project. The goal of the redevelopment of Jordan Downs is to create a vibrant urban village that the residents and community stakeholders will begin to help plan at the Community Workshops.

Jordan Downs public housing complex is located in Watts. Originally developed as semi-permanent housing for industry defense workers, shipyard workers and World War II workers, the Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles converted what is now known as Jordan Downs into public housing in the early 1950's as one of the last public housing complexes to open in Los Angeles.

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
