Dear Mr. Guthrie:

Thank you for providing the recommended wage rates and fringe benefit data for your Authority's routine and non-routine maintenance personnel.

In accordance with and pursuant to Section 12 of the U.S. Housing Act, as amended, enclosed are the approved HUD forms 52158, Maintenance Wage Rate Determination. The HUD forms 52158 are retroactively effective to coincide with your fiscal year beginning January 1, 2021 and will expire December 31, 2022.

The minimum wage rates reflected on the HUD forms 52158, Maintenance Wage Rate Determination, must be paid to all maintenance employees, as well as part-time and temporary employees. Any decision to pay rates in excess of these minimums approved by HUD is at your discretion. However, a payment above the prevailing wages is not justification for increasing operating subsidies.
